## THE WHITECHAPEL OPEN EXHIBITION 1982

This exhibition, selected from nearly 1200 works and proposals submitted by local artists and craftsmen, follows a pattern established over the past five years, but also has a number of new features.

For regular visitors to the Whitechapel the most obvious change will be that it is taking place at a different season of the year. The earlier tradition of a summer exhibition had a number of drawbacks for artists submitting work, for general public faced with yet another mixed 'summer show' in the London exhibition calendar and for the gallery in its wish to encourage a dialogue between local artists and local community groups, firms, schools and children. The timing effectively prevented teachers from bringing groups and discouraged visitors from following up interest in a particular artist. The new timing should allow this kind of exchange, though we would particularly like to thank those artists and craftsmen who overcame an unforeseen hazard by braving the first onset of snow and sleet before Christmas to take their work to Hawksmoor's great church of St. George's-in-the-East, where the selection was made.

The range of work shown reflects the wide range of work submitted and indicates how difficult it was for the Gallery to accommodate all the interesting work being made. During selection we avoided categorisation as such, but in the process of making decisions it is inevitable that we should compare roughly equivalent items whether they be joint schools projects, topographical views or abstract paintings. The present exhibition shows, to a greater extent than before, the very wide range of approaches and purposes which direct the making of art and craft in East London. The exhibition brings together items which are often kept separate by traditional classifications such as amateur and professional, art and craft, figurative and abstract. It also serves as a platform for the very large number of younger artists, many of whom have recently left college, and who now live or work in East London. They come perhaps for economic reasons, but increasingly have a part to play in the community, through public exhibition of their work, through involvement in educational projects or work in public places and, not least, through the stimulation of employment by encouraging the regeneration which is occuring in parts of the area. As a supplement to the catalogue we are publishing a selective directory of the educational establishments, art suppliers and associated companies operating in the area. This is partly as a service to visitors who might like to find materials or know about courses, but it also discloses the remarkable amount of activity now happening in East London.

We are most grateful to Barclays Bank for their support of the exhibition. It was their regional office which recognised the contribution which might be made by living artists and craftsmen in the life of any community and which decided to take the unusual step, for a major sponsor, of supporting an exhibition of contemporary rather than historical art. Their involvement has brought new factors into the conception of the exhibition, which we welcome, and has also made it possible to give the exhibition much wider publicity than hitherto. Such support is essential for the continuing development of the Whitechapel's programme, though we are also happy to acknowledge that without the significant statutory support provided by the Arts Council, and local authorities, including the GLC, GLAA, ILEA and Boroughs of Tower Hamlets and Hackney, there might not be any base on which to build.
